


WHY PAPER?

PAPER AND THE MAKING OF LONDON



As our lives sink deeper into the digital world surrounded by communication platforms and constant notifications, how civilized it feels to consider a fresh, blank sheet of paper.

From the gravitas of the legally binding scroll to the urge to make a mark, a casual doodle as you day dream, paper is less

a neutral surface than an enabling technology of culture. In Britain, papermaking moved from rag-based, gelatin-sized laid sheets to Whatman's revolutionary wove papers (1757), reshaping drawing and printmaking; the Fourdrinier machine (1803, Frogmore) industrialised supply; and the Stationers' Company with Fleet Street built an information economy upon it—from chancery writs and bills of exchange to the Philosophical Transactions and the daily press.

First produced in ancient China, it quickly spread across the world; the humble sheet's versatility inspires the beauty and the unexpected when in the hands of creatives who elevate its status to that of the most precious materials.

Our paper journey unfolds through a London you won't have experienced before, we'll peek into vaults of 18th Century treasures, marvel at papier-mâché ceilings and visit the studios that are the creative spaces producing works derived from the written word to the most intricate fibrous details.

This trip is timed to coincide with the leading art fair for contemporary craft and design, organized by the British Crafts Council, which profiles some of the most established names in the business, as well as introducing a fresh new next generation of makers.

All you need is your desire to peruse beautiful papers and an open mind to try your own hand at making.


DAY 3

Two very different paper studios

We head South of the River to enter the world of a devoted artisan, surrounded by leather helmets, swords, sketches and notebooks that have inspired commissions for an enviable list of royal and celebrity clients. A bookbinder by training, we meet the creative powerhouse behind the exquisite leather projects for bespoke interiors and be introduced to the cluster of studios that have sprung from his roots.



Adjust your temperament for the afternoon where we join the subtle aesthetic of an artist influenced by the simple beauty of traditional and contemporary Japanese crafts. This studio creates wall works and sculptures from paper yarn and weaving.

Fittingly, it is based in one of our favourite creative spaces: Cockpit, an award-winning social enterprise and home to over 175 independent creative businesses in the heart of central London.



DAY 4

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 24, 2026

Presses and prints

A little known studio community in Hoxton, East London, produces some of the specialist printing methods behind several blue-chip artists you certainly do know. Standpoint is the home to the centuries-old craftsmanship of letter presses working on contemporary design ideas and an



extensive conservation studio for archival material, large works on paper and parchment. We love their multi-faceted welcoming ethos that encompasses education, professional practice, residencies, tours and community work.

The afternoon is dedicated to an intimate view of a contemporary maker of nature prints. The specific nature printing method she works with was lost for almost 150 years so both historical and practical research has been a significant part of her practice. This home studio visit will be a special moment to review the reference material (including original 1850s prints) that informs the layers of study behind the finished article.

Before heading back for dinner we've scheduled a visit to the freshly opened V&A East Storehouse – a radical new concept in viewing museum collections where Isabelle has picked out a couple of unusual historic works of art on our theme.

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

Devoted to the science of natural history


The vault in the basement is the highlight of any tour of the Linnean society founded in 1788. Our guide will reveal the manuscripts, books and specimens of plants, fish, shells, and insects, of Carl Linnaeus. Included is a visit of the *Cabinets of Wonder | Archives of Disillusionment* exhibit. All these secrets are hidden metres away from London's Piccadilly in Mayfair.

After lunch we return to the present day with a visit to the studio of an artist that crafts botanical collages from newspaper cuttings. These beautiful florals document the times we are living in, as she finds a creative way of processing news that unsettles her.

Collect Art Fair

The leading international art fair for contemporary craft and design occupies three wings at the Grade 1 listed grandeur of London's Somerset House. With approximately 400 artists presented by galleries and special projects from around the globe, Collect Art Fair celebrates 23 years, as the only annual art fair in the UK and international circuit dedicated to museum quality contemporary craft.

A special tour in addition to free time to explore yourself will be much needed.

Gothic Castles & Tracey Emin

A grand finale of this trip sees a trio of varied visits.

Starting with Britain's finest example of Georgian Gothic Revival architecture. Strawberry Hill House and Garden, created by Horace Walpole in the 18th century is a lovely little Gothic Castle we'll have to ourselves whilst our tour guide talks us through the jaw dropping papier-mâché, wood and plaster moulding ceiling painted to look like ancient carved stone. The location of Strawberry Hill is as charming as it sounds and is a destination for Londoners in search of peaceful living. Lunch is enjoyed at The Garden Café nestled in the Great Cloister with glorious views across Horace Walpole's 18th century naturalistic garden.

From castle to industrial estate, we visit a family-owned printing company founded in 1963 that creates fastidiously produced textiles and wallpapers, upholding generations of British printmaking expertise. Combining hand-crafted precision with refined mechanical processes, the workshop preserves techniques that link today's designers to the great decorative traditions of the past.

Rue Pigalle being a champion of women, creativity and making, a fitting end to our trip sees us at the world renowned Tate Modern for a landmark exhibition tracing 40 years of Tracey Emin's groundbreaking practice.
