Re A Go Amogela Mo or 'welcome to' Xigera Safari Lodge. I was born not far from the lodge, on the western edge of the Okavango Delta. For as long as I can remember, I've been drawn to the bush; to the rhythms of the land, the stories in the tracks, and the deep presence of wildlife that surrounds us in Botswana.

Xigera has always held a special place in that landscape. One of the Delta's original lodges, it has stood rooted in water and wilderness. But over the past few years, something extraordinary has happened. The land has changed. The waters have shifted. And with it, Xigera too has been reborn.

Once known as a "wet camp," Xigera is now a rare lodge, with up to five different daily experiences available on land and water.

Game viewing here is abundant and diverse: wild dogs have denned on our land, two lion prides roam nearby, and leopard, cheetah,

elephant, and buffalo are frequent guests, sometimes visiting us in the lodge itself.



And it's what makes us, as a team, incredibly proud. We are all deeply connected to this land and its heritage, and we cannot wait to share its beauty with you.



The story of Xigera is one of renewal, rebirth, and legacy. It is a story born from family, guided by purpose, and shaped by a pioneering spirit, one that has always sought out Africa's most soulful wild places.

That same spirit inspired a radical reimagining of what a safari in the Okavango Delta could be. This is Xigera (pronounced kee-jera), named for the Pied Kingfisher that hovers above the Delta's glistening channels.

Every element has been handcrafted to awaken the senses and stir the soul; from sculptural interiors and meaningful design to deeply personal wildlife encounters.

Xigera is also more than a lodge. It is a statement. A bold and imaginative vision of how to savour the Delta.

A line drawn in the sand of luxury travel, one that says: it is possible to honour place, culture, and conservation, while offering something rare, refined, and unforgettable. This is not just a safari. It is Xigera.



African Luxury, Redefined

Xigera is not just in the Okavango Delta, it is of it. Rooted in a landscape of seasonal floodplains, riverine forest, tawny grasslands, and glassy papyrus channels, the lodge rests gently within this World Heritage wilderness, almost hidden beneath a canopy of indigenous trees.

Every architectural detail at Xigera reflects a deep reverence for the Delta. The fluidity of its rooflines mirrors the flight of indigenous birds, the rich textures of dark cladding echo ancient trees.

Each of our 12 suites is a sanctuary of stillness and design, crafted to disappear into nature, designed to awaken the senses.

Positioned for total seclusion, each suite offers uninterrupted views of the Delta's floodplains. Inside, a sense of stillness and spaciousness prevails: separate lounge, bedroom, and dressing areas, all

air-conditioned for comfort, and opening onto a private deck with shaded daybeds, where time slows and the wild drifts by.

Crafted with sustainability at its core, Xigera runs on solar power and was designed to tread lightly on the land.

But beyond architecture, Xigera is also a living celebration of African creativity. From the sculpted doors to the woven chairs, every detail has been designed and made by hand. With over 80 artists and artisans contributing, art is not simply placed here, it is part of the experience.

This is African luxury, redefined: intimate, soulful, and deeply grounded in place.

Xigera is designed to feel. Every space you enter, every object you touch, has been imagined and handcrafted by some of Africa's most visionary creatives.

Over 80 artists, designers, and artisans from across the continent have contributed to what is the largest privately-owned collection of contemporary African art in hospitality. But this is not a gallery. It is a living, breathing expression of the Delta.


Beneath a canopy of ancient trees, the lodge's sculptural architecture flows like the Delta itself. Furniture is carved, cast, woven and fired by hand, each piece with a story, a maker, a soul.


In the boma, stories are shared around a totemic fire-pit by Conrad Hicks, forged to



Inside, an open kitchen-dining room transforms every meal into an interactive experience, while the waterside lounge is anchored by a copper-clad fireplace sculpted in the form of a lily; the emblem of Xigera, and the Delta's most iconic bloom.

A Love Letter to the African Bush

Xigera redefines the safari experience; one where immersion in nature meets thoughtful hospitality and an unwavering commitment to conservation. Every aspect of the lodge, from its sculptural design to the way a guest's day unfolds, has been considered to honour Botswana's land, its heritage, its wildlife, and its people.

There are no fixed schedules here.
Every experience is tailored to your rhythm, your curiosity. The wildlife is abundant. The freedom is real.

Family-owned and deeply rooted in this place, we've invested in Botswana's tourism for over 30 years. Xigera is our love letter to the Okavango Delta, a lodge shaped by reverence for nature, belief in people, and cultural pride.











A Wilderness Wonderland

Xigera offers rare access to some of the richest wildlife viewing in Botswana. From the moment you arrive, the Delta reveals itself, quietly, boldly, unmistakably.

A leopard draped lazily across a tree limb. A pride of lions stretched out in the sun, unfazed by your presence. Wild dogs weaving between islands. Buffalo gathered in the golden light. Here, nature is not a performance, it is a pulse.

When the floods arrive, they awaken everything. Fish eagles call across the water. Papyrus shimmers in the breeze. Red lechwe flash across the floodplains. Spotted hyena track scent trails at dusk. Kudu and wildebeest graze in the soft amber of late afternoon.

And then there are the elephants. The icons of the Delta. This part of Botswana is home to the world's largest population of African elephants, over 130,000 roam free. At Xigera,

they are part of daily life, herds wading through channels, feeding beside the decks, or wandering silently through camp.

For birders, Xigera is a marvel. With more than 500 species recorded in the Okavango Delta, the skies and reeds come alive with colour and sound, from the coppery-tailed coucal and wattled crane to the western-banded snake eagle and lesser jacana.

This is Xigera where the wild is not simply observed. It is felt. It is heard. It stays with you.



Touching the Earth Lightly


Xigera was built with a single guiding principle: to honour and protect the Okavango Delta. As a UNESCO World Heritage Site, this fragile ecosystem demands care, and we meet that responsibility with action.

Our lodge is powered by a cutting-edge solar plant, generating 92% of our energy and eliminating the need for diesel generators. Hot water comes from thermodynamic geysers, and our water is purified using reverse osmosis, then re-mineralised, making it safe to drink throughout the lodge.

We operate without single-use plastics, and our onsite composter transforms organic waste into nutrient-rich support for local gardens. Every choice, from infrastructure to ingredient, is made to reduce impact.

Beyond operations, we work hand-in-hand with Botswana's Department of Wildlife and National Parks, supporting conservation and biodiversity monitoring. We are proud partners of Wild Entrust, a local NGO dedicated to applied science, education, and sustainable development.

Sustainability is not a philosophy. It is how we live, lead, and protect what we love.









Conservation in Action

Conservation is central to everything we do. We are proud to work with leading local and international partners on projects that protect Botswana's biodiversity and to try and ensure the Delta remains a sanctuary for generations to come.

We are honoured to partner with Wild Entrust, a Botswana-based not-for-profit organisation that drives conservation through applied science, education, and sustainable development. Together, we support wildlife monitoring and data collection efforts across the region.

Our commitment extends across key conservation partnerships:

- Al-driven research and wildlife tracking tools allow us to monitor predator populations noninvasively and with precision.
- Through direct support of Raptors

 Botswana, we help protect endangered birds of prey, and assist in conserving the wattled crane, one of Africa's most threatened bird species.

- In partnership with the Giraffe Conservation Foundation, we support studies into giraffe genetic hybridisation within the Delta.
- We work closely with Botswana's
 Department of Wildlife and National

 Parks to support anti-poaching initiatives
 and wildlife law enforcement.

Guests also have the opportunity to engage with Botswana's only elephant orphanage, **Elephant Havens**, which rescues and rehabilitates orphaned elephants with the goal of releasing them back into the wild.

Experiences with **Helicopter Horizons** include ethical, guided visits that contribute directly to the organisation's work.

By embracing a low-volume, high-value tourism model, Xigera protects not just place, but possibility, proving that luxury and conservation can work collaboratively together.

Village Lights & Learning

In collaboration with Coaching Conservation, we've supported the distribution of solar-powered lights and conservation-focused learning materials to Habu's primary school learners. With few homes having electricity, this small intervention opens doors to the local youth learning long after sunset

Our art tour is not just about aesthetic appreciation, it's about storytelling and values. From recycled materials to fallen woods, many pieces at Xigera reflect our deep respect for sustainability and craftsmanship. Guests are invited to explore this creativity and care through our self-guided or hosted art experiences.



Coaching Conservation Programme


We support conservation education that inspires through play. Through BushRAP and Animal RAP programmes, students from Habu engage with wildlife meaningfully learning about self-respect, empathy, and environmental stewardship in ways that stay with them.

Partnering with Communities

We are proud to partner with Habu Village, one of the Delta's closest communities, supporting sustainable farming, education, and conservation efforts. Our long-term relationship with Wild Entrust enables initiatives that reduce human-wildlife conflict and promote coexistence.

Every action, every initiative, every partnership is rooted in care, connection, and shared purpose.





COLLABORATION

Food Rooted in Place, Made With Purpose

Food here is more than a meal; it's a philosophy, a celebration of land, season, and the people who grow and gather with care.

Our approach honours place and people. It's what we call radius cooking with purpose: sourcing as locally and ethically as possible, supporting small-scale farmers and producers who share our values of sustainability, quality, and community upliftment.

Over 90% of our fresh produce comes from nearby Maun, just 60 miles from the lodge. We work with:

- Slebtech Farms, a small, family-run egg farm employing members of the local community and supplying our staff canteen.
- Bellfrog Farms, a hydroponic farm that provides tomatoes, herbs, lettuce, and spring onions, using vertical farming techniques wellsuited to the Delta's climate.
- Grow Wild Organics, a small farm providing quail eggs and seasonal produce.
- Women-owned cooperatives, who supply traditional local ingredients and small-batch items.

- Elliewood Farms, a sustainable, fullcircle farm supplying our lamb and seasonal vegetables. We select and prepare lamb in-house, with butchery and ageing done onsite.
- Free-range poultry farmers, whose birds are hormone- and antibioticfree, raised on natural diets.
- Sustainable seafood suppliers, sourcing only seasonal, responsible catches from the Namibian coast.

Our single-source, grass-fed beef is hormonefree and carefully butchered and dry-aged in-house, ensuring quality from source to plate.

Every dish reflects a respect for both origin and impact. This is farm-to-table, reimagined. Real food. Real stories. Always exceptional.




A Place Like No Other

Where We Are

- Located on the western edge of Botswana's Moremi Game Reserve, in the heart of the 15,000 km² Okavango Delta. A UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- Accessible via a scenic 25-minute charter flight from Maun, followed by a short vehicle or boat transfer.
- Suspended between two islands and shaded by ancient forest, the lodge rests in nature, offering endless views of the floodplains.



Sleep in Luxury, Designed by Nature

- 12 individually designed, air-conditioned suites, including a two-bedroom Family Suite. Each offering over 180m² of private indoor and outdoor living.
- Crafted to exist in harmony with the Delta, with panoramic views, total seclusion, and interiors that breathe with their surroundings.
- Outdoor gazebos and king-sized daybeds for quiet and tranquillity.
- Indoor and outdoor showers, freestanding bathtubs with open views, and thoughtful touches including inroom safes, flat-screen TVs, and Wi-Fi, always optional, never expected.







The Baobab Treehouse

- A sculptural sanctuary rising 10 metres above the floodplain, open to the stars, surrounded by nothing but nature and night.
- Private, secure, and deeply moving, this is one of Africa's most extraordinary sleepouts.


Crafted With Purpose
